## WORK WITH US

Timeline of KOICA's Bilateral Project / Program

### Ongoing Programming

- Korean government establishes ODA strategies and plans, including the ODA Annual Implementation Plan
- KOICA sets **Country Plans (CP)**, **Mid-term Sectoral Strategy**, etc.

### N-2 years Identification

- Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) and KOICA establish the Project Identification Guideline
- Partner country submits a **Project Concept Paper (PCP)** to KOICA

### Review

- KOICA selects a **shortlist** of projects for further study and in-depth review

### Project Design

- KOICA conducts a **Preliminary Study** of shortlisted projects, and produces the first draft of the **Project Document (PD)**

### N-1 year Project Selection

JAN~FEB

- KOICA reviews the **second draft of the PD**, then narrows down a list of potential projects

### N-1 year **Budget Review**

APR~DEC

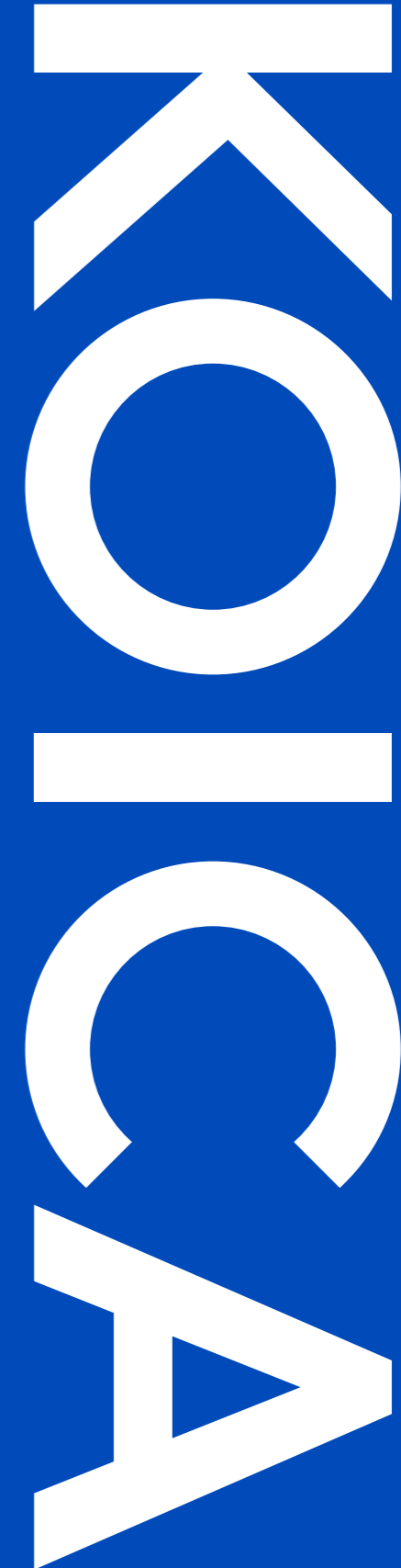
- KOICA submits the list of potential projects for **Budget Review**

### N-1 year Planning

- KOICA conducts a **Project Formulation Study** to produce the **final draft of the PD**
- KOICA and the partner country government sign a **Record of Discussions (RD)** to officially agree on the scope of the proposed project and deliverables

### Year N ~ Implementation

- KOICA contracts **project operators / implementation organization(s)**
- KOICA and partner country government regularly monitor and evaluate progress
- KOICA undertakes annual reviews to assess the state of projects
- End-of-project evaluation is carried out at the end of a project
- Ex-post evaluation is conducted until 5-7 years after project completion

## WHO WE ARE

- KOICA, established in 1991, is a grant provider under the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Korea.
- By sharing Korea's development experiences and know-how with partner countries, KOICA aims to support their sustainable growth, achieve mutual prosperity, and strengthen friendly relations.

## SCALE OF SUPPORT

- As of 2022, KOICA is in charge of 24.9% of Korea's total Official Development Assistance (ODA) and is Korea's representative grant agency, implementing **48.3%** of the country's grants. From 17.4 billion won (13 million dollars) in 1991, the agency's budget has grown to **1.137 trillion won (852 million dollars)** in 2022. This is in line with the Korean government's commitment to contribute to the international community and membership at the OECD Development Assistance Committee (DAC). We seek to continuously increase our ODA/GNI ratio in the future.

- KOICA contributes to common prosperity and the promotion of world peace through inclusive, mutual development cooperation that leaves no one behind.
- KOICA acts as a development cooperation platform by forging partnerships with various stakeholders including government ministries, public institutions, businesses, academia, civil society, and UN development agencies. 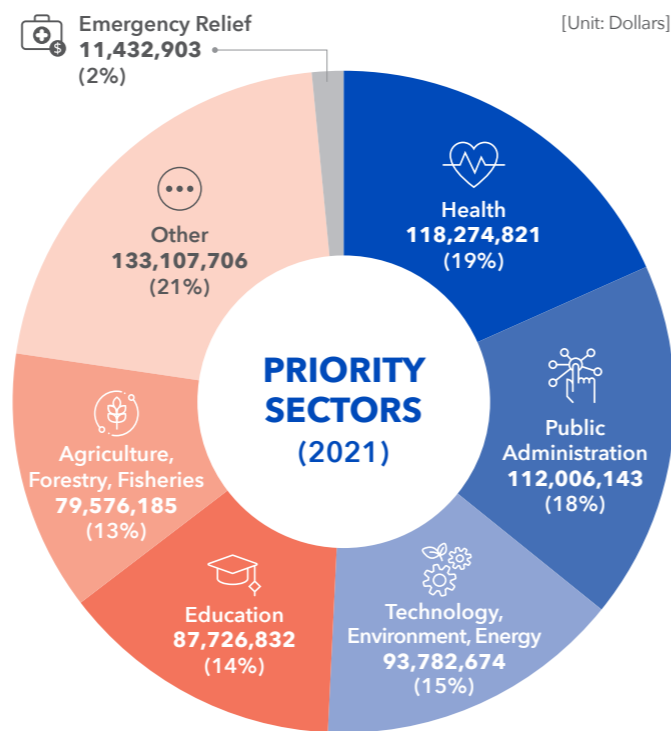

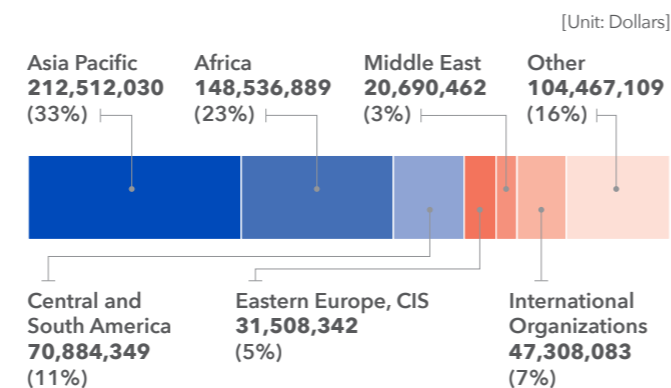

## SUPPORT BY SECTOR



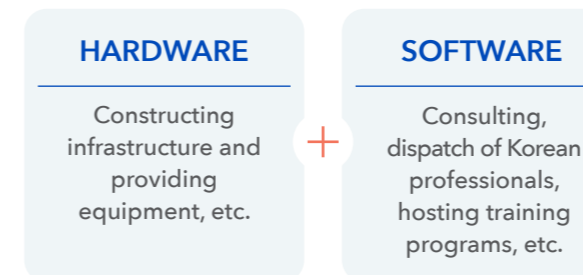
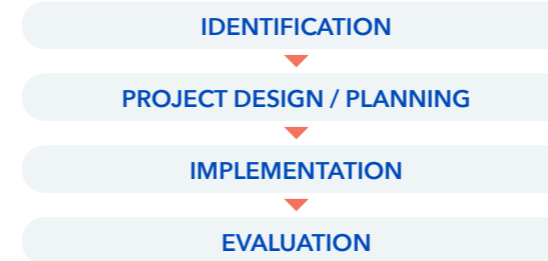
## SUPPORT BY REGION (2021)



## MAIN PROGRAMS

### Bilateral Projects and Development Experience Exchange Program (DEEP)

- KOICA supports the sustainable socio-economic development of partner countries in alignment with the Korean government's regional diplomacy strategies and the development goals of each partner country.
- To this end, KOICA implements integrated projects in a systematic way. Based on its mid- and long-term strategies, KOICA combines material and human resources to meet the development needs of each country.



### Public-Private Partnership

KOICA actively combines its development cooperation activities with the expertise of the private sector, including businesses, civil society, and universities.

### Multilateral Cooperation

KOICA strives to enhance the effectiveness of development cooperation in partnership with other donor agencies, international organizations, and NGOs, bringing together their expertise and networks.

### Fellowship Program (CIAT)

As part of its human resources development program, KOICA invites engineers, policymakers, public officials, and sector experts of partner countries to Korea for capacity building. We seek to transfer knowledge on Korea's development experience and technological expertise, with the ultimate goal of supporting the sustainable development of partner countries.

### Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief

KOICA supports countries suffering from natural disasters, conflicts, and diseases by dispatching relief workers and providing supplies and funds.

### Development Innovation Programs

KOICA offers partnership programs that combine the creative technology of partner organizations and our Official Development Assistance projects.
